RE: Governor Signs Four IAPD Platform Bills into Law / OSLAD Update

We hope you had a fantastic Independence Day!

We have some exciting news! We are happy to report that **Governor Pritzker** has signed four IAPD Platform bills into law.

SB 1840 / Public Act 103-0235 (Sims, E., Jr. / Slaughter, J.) expands the permissible uses of the park district police system levy under Section 5-9 of the Park District Code by permitting those funds to be used for other public safety and security measures such as security personnel, emergency call boxes, active shooter trainings, and security lighting and cameras. This new flexibility will be instrumental in helping park districts protect their patrons in the future.

HB 2277 / Public Act 103-0153 (Moeller, A. / Morrison, J.) clarifies that part-time special activity or recreation programs provided by park districts do not require a DCFS license if they are offered to children who have attained the age of 3, meet no more than 3.5 continuous hours at a time, and are offered no more than 25 total hours during any week. This legislation will solve the issue many park districts have faced when DCFS representatives confuse periodic programs offered to preschoolers with full-time licensed daycares that are offered by other park districts.

HB 2192 / Public Act 103-0146 (Didech, D. / Ellman, L.) allows park districts to enter into solar energy and equipment agreements for up to 20 years, thereby allowing park districts to save taxpayer dollars on utilities while helping to protect the environment. This legislation will solve the issue some park districts have confronted when attempting to enter into solar energy-related contracts, many of which require longer term investments than are currently permitted by the Park District Code.

<u>HB 2033 / Public Act 103-0137 (Stephens, B. / Chesney, A.)</u> allows all units of local government, including park districts, forest preserve districts, and conservation districts, to file their bond ordinances electronically with the county clerk.

All four of these new laws are effective immediately.

IAPD thanks Governor Pritzker and the General Assembly for approving these legislative measures as well as our legislative sponsors for getting these Platform proposals across the finish line.

The Governor previously signed <u>SB 250 / Public Act 103-0006 (Sims, E., Jr. / Gordon-Booth, J.)</u>, which contains the new State Fiscal Year 2024 budget. The budget contains another \$56 million appropriation for OSLAD grants, grant appropriations and re-appropriations, and funding for member-initiative projects.

OSLAD Update

Speaking of OSLAD, we also wanted to remind you that the <u>new OSLAD grant application cycle</u> officially opened on Monday, July 3. Although the cycle is open, you will note that the <u>State's website</u> is not yet updated with the relevant links and information. Once these links are available, we will update <u>IAPD's Grants webpage</u>, so please check there for the latest information.

The deadline to apply is August 31, 2023.

With so much funding available for the second straight year, we encourage all IAPD member agencies to submit an OSLAD grant application and take advantage of this great opportunity.

Also, IDNR has informed us that it anticipates opening the next cycle for the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) grant program on August 1, 2023.

The <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> are not scheduled to return to the Capitol until the Fall Veto Session from October 24-26 and November 7-9.

As a reminder, you can view the status of all of the bills we are tracking during the 103rd General Assembly through <u>IAPD's Bill Tracker</u> on the IAPD website.

We will continue to update you as the Governor takes action on bills that were approved by the General Assembly throughout the next month.

RE: Governor Signs More Bills Into Law

In last <u>Wednesday's Legislative Update</u> we reported that four IAPD's Platform bills were signed into law and are effective immediately.

During the past several weeks, the Governor has also signed several other bills we have been tracking.

In addition to the state budget, <u>SB 250 / Public Act 103-0006 (Sims, E., Jr. / Gordon-Booth, J.)</u>, that we also covered in last Wednesday's update, the Governor has signed <u>HB 3817 / Public Act 103-0008 (Gordon-Booth, J. / Sims, E., Jr.</u>) that establishes the FY 2024 Budget Implementation or (BIMP) Act. The BIMP is a 900-page omnibus companion bill that contains numerous provisions related to the State budget appropriations, including grant program allocations, and other provisions.

SB 325 / Public Act 103-0069 (Cunningham, B. / Didech, D.) will amend the Freedom of Information Act to provide that none of the records or documents obtained by the Public Access Counselor (PAC) from a public body for the purposes of addressing a request for review may be disclosed to the public by the PAC. Current law only prohibits disclosures of records or documents where a public body has asserted a FOIA exemption. This law is effective January 1, 2024.

Beginning July 1, 2026, <u>SB 1715 / Public Act 103-0223 (Glowiak Hilton, S. / Ladisch Douglass, J.)</u> will require the installation of a filling station for personal use water bottles in new construction in locations where drinking fountains are required under the Illinois Plumbing Code.

Under prior law, a downstate forest preserve district may only maintain a Landfill Expense Fund for a period of up to 40 years following the closure of a sanitary landfill or pollution control facility on the forest preserve district's property. HB 2622 / Public Act 103-0165 (Mussman, M. / Lewis, S.) removes this limitation, allows the fund to be invested beyond 40 years, and is effective immediately.

Also effective immediately, <u>HB 3733 / Public Act 103-0201 (Olickal, K. / Villivalam, R.)</u> amends several labor laws that require employers to post notices at their physical workplace to also require employers to provide those notices electronically to employees who do not regularly report to a physical workplace, such as employees who work remotely or travel for work. An employer may fulfill this requirement by email or by posting the information on the employer's website or intranet site if the employer regularly uses these websites to communicate work-related information to employees.

Effective January 1, 2024, <u>HB 3491 / Public Act 103-0048 (Hanson, M. / Preston, W.)</u> will provide that any laborer, worker, or mechanic employed by a contractor or subcontractor that is paid less than the prevailing wage with a right of action for the difference between the amount paid and the prevailing rates required to be paid.

HB 3902 / Public Act 103-0101 (Hernandez, B. / Holmes, L.) grants law enforcement agencies limited authority to use drones for security purposes at special events hosted by the State and units of local government, including park districts, forest preserve districts, and conservation districts, such as parades, walks, races, concerts, and food festivals. This law is effective immediately.

SB 1883 / Public Act 103-0239 (Holmes, L. / Mason, J.) will prohibit any person from allowing any member of the public to come into direct contact with a bear or nonhuman primate such as a monkey or ape. The law creates an exemption for certain individuals, including employees of a local agency acting in the course of their official duty, the owner of the animal, the owner of a facility where an animal is kept, a trained professional employee or contractor of the owner of the animal or facility, and veterinarians. Violations of the Act are a Class B misdemeanor. This law is effective January 1, 2024.

\$56 Million in OSLAD Grant Funding Now Available

As we also reported last Wednesday, the new OSLAD grant cycle is now open and applications are due **no later than 5:00 p.m. on August 31, 2023**.

Since our update last week, some of the IDNR links to important grant information are now live.

For specific details on the program, including scoring criteria and grant program rules and restrictions, we encourage you to review the <u>Notice of Funding Opportunity</u>.

All applications must be submitted through the <u>State's AmpliFund grant</u> management system.

Again this year, OSLAD will provide up to \$600,000 in matching funds for park development projects (\$1,125,000 for acquisition projects). Also, communities designated as being distressed will be eligible to receive up to 100% funding. A list of distressed communities for this FY 24 grant cycle is expected soon. Please continue to check IDNR's website for this list.

As a reminder, all applicants must be pre-qualified through the <u>State of Illinois</u> <u>Grantee Portal</u>. Additional information on prequalification is <u>available here</u>.

As we reported last Wednesday, IDNR has informed us that it anticipates opening the next cycle for the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) grant program on August 1, 2023.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF AN OSLAD GRANT APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the Golf Maine Park District, Cook County, Illinois (the "District"), is a duly organized and existing Park District created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is now operating under the provisions of The Park District Code of the State of Illinois, 70 ILCS 1205/1-1 *et seq.*, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto;

WHEREAS, the Golf Maine Park District has scheduled public meeting(s) with the discussion directly to the redevelopment of the Dee Park;

WHEREAS, the Golf Maine Park District has engaged the services of Design Perspectives to assist it in the preparation of an OSLAD Grant;

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined that it has one hundred percent (100%) of the funds necessary to complete the contemplated pending OSLAD project within a time frame specified for project execution through the use of its bonding capacity at any time on and after the date of this Resolution;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE GOLF MAINE PARK DISTRICT, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1:</u> The recitals are incorporated herein as express provisions of this Resolution. <u>SECTION 2:</u> The Executive Advisor of the Park District is directed and authorized to prepare and submit an OSLAD Grant Application for the redevelopment of Dee Park.

<u>SECTION 3:</u> The Executive Advisor is authorized to utilize consultants and attorneys, on a priority basis for the preparation and presentation of the Application.

SECTION 4: The Board of Commissioners has determined that it has one hundred percent (100%) of the funds necessary to complete the pending OSLAD project within the time frames specified herein for project execution, and that failure to adhere to the specified project time frame or failure to proceed with the project because of insufficient funds for project grant termination which will result in the ineligibility of the local project sponsor for subsequent Illinois DNR outdoor recreation grant assistance consideration following project termination as

described in the program guidelines.

SECTION 5: The Board of Commissioners of the Golf Maine Park District understand that an OSLAD Grant Application requires it to comply with all terms, conditions and regulations of the grant program and will maintain the project area in an attractive and safe conditions, keep the facilities open to the general public during reasonable hours consistent with the type of facility, and obtain from the Illinois DNR written approval for any change or conversion of approved recreation use of the project prior to initiating such change or conversion; and for property acquired with OSLAD grant assistance, agree to place a covenant restriction on the project property deed at the time of recording that stipulates the property must be used, in perpetuity, for public recreation purposes in accordance with the grant program and cannot be sold or exchanged, in whole or part, to another party without approval from the Illinois DNR.
