IDNR Releases Distressed Communities List for Current OSLAD Grant Cycle

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources has released its list of distressed communities for the current OSLAD grant application cycle, <u>available here</u>. Funding through OSLAD will cover 100% of eligible projects located in distressed communities.

As a reminder, the deadline to apply is August 31, 2023. All applicants must be pre-qualified through the <u>State of Illinois Grantee Portal</u>. Additional information on prequalification is available <u>here</u>. All applications must be submitted through the <u>State's AmpliFund grant management system</u>.

IEPA Announces \$10 Million in Funding Availability for Water Quality Projects

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency recently announced \$10 million in funding is available through the <u>Green Infrastructure Grant Opportunities</u> (GIGO) Program.

For the purposes of GIGO, green infrastructure means any stormwater management technique or practice employed with the primary goal to preserve, restore, mimic, or enhance natural hydrology. Green infrastructure includes, but is not limited to, projects and practices that improve water quality in Illinois by preventing, eliminating, or reducing stormwater runoff into Illinois' rivers, streams, and lakes.

The Notice of Funding Opportunity is available here, and the deadline to apply is October 18, 2023.

This reimbursement program provides up to 75% of approved project costs with awards ranging from \$75,000 to \$2,500,000.

IDNR Accepting Applications for Illinois Park District Habitat Improvement Grant

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources is now accepting applications for the Illinois Park District Habitat Improvement Grant.

This program provides reimbursement grants to park districts that are members of IAPD to work with students or a local youth group to develop pollinator gardens and/or native tree habitats. The deadline to apply is November 30, 2023.

General requirements for the program are:

- The project must take place on park district property and be accessible to the public at no charge.
- Students from a local school or participants of a local youth group must participate.

- The project should be completed in April, May, or June 2024.
- The grant is a reimbursement grant. The park district must pay for the approved expenses, submit verification of payment documents, and then receive reimbursement from the Illinois Conservation Foundation.
- The park district should maintain the project for a minimum of five years.

IDPH Announces \$10 Million Air Purifier Program for Day Care Centers

In order to receive an air purifier, plus a three-year supply of filters, licensed day care providers must <u>fill out an online request form</u> and submit it **no later** than <u>July 31, 2023</u>.

RE: Governor Signs More Legislation of Interest to IAPD Member Agencies

As we stated in <u>previous Legislative Updates</u>, we will continue to update you as the Governor takes action on bills we tracked during the Spring Session that passed both chambers of the General Assembly and that may impact or be of interest to you, your board, and your agency.

HB 1363 / Public Act 103-0282 (Guzzardi, W. / Villa, K.) clarifies that an employer is liable for gender-related violence committed by an employee or agent in the workplace if the employer fails to train, supervise, or monitor the employee, or fails to investigate complaints or reports about the employee and fails to take remedial measures in response to those complaints. Furthermore, the employer is only liable if the interaction giving rise to the gender-related violence arises out of and in the course of employment with the employer, i.e., while the employee was directly performing the employee's job duties and the gender-related violence was the proximate cause of the injury; or while the agent of the employer was directly involved in the performance of the contracted work and the gender-related violence was the proximate cause of the injury. This law is effective immediately.

HB 1526 / Public Act 103-0284 (Harper, S. / Hunter, M.) creates the Outdoor Rx Program to provide grants to public and private agencies to provide outdoor

environmental, ecological, agricultural, or other natural resource-based or outdoor-based therapy programs to Illinois residents. The program will be administered by the Department of Human Services based on feedback provided by an advisory committee created through the Department of Natural Resources. IAPD will be actively monitoring the implementation of this program. This law is effective January 1, 2024.

Also effective January 1, 2024, <u>HB 1540 / (Public Act Number Pending) (Lilly, C. / Morrison, J.)</u> will ban "electronic smoking devices," also known as ecigarettes, in locations where smoking is prohibited under the Smoke Free Illinois Act.

HB 2068 / Public Act 103-0291 (Mah, T. / Villivalam, R.) is intended to promote the use of the public transit system of the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) in Cook and the Collar Counties by employees who work for larger employers near a fixed-route transit service stop. Beginning January 1, 2024, the law will require employers with 50 or more full-time employees who work an average of 35-hours-per week to establish a payroll deduction system that permits employees to use pre-tax dollars for the purchase of a transit pass if 1) the employer is located in Cook County or in specified townships in the Collar Counties as detailed on page 1, lines 10-23 and page 2, lines 1-7 in the erolled bill, and 2) the employer has 50 or more full- time employees who are employed at an address within one mile of a fixed-route transit service. Employers may comply by participating in a program offered by the RTA or Chicago Transportation Authority (CTA). If the benefit is required, it must be offered to employees starting on the employee's first full pay period after 120 days of employment.

HB 2447 / Public Act 103-0311 (Avelar, D. / Loughran Cappel, M.) amends the Open Meetings Act to add unexpected childcare obligations to the current list of reasons that a public body member may attend a meeting remotely if a quorum of the members of the public body is physically present and the public body has met the other statutory requirements, including the adoption of a remote attendance policy. Public bodies with existing remote attendance policies will need to update those policies in order to avail themselves of this new option. This law is effective immediately.

HB 2493 / Public Act 103-0314 (Ortiz, A. / Peters, R.) amends the Victim's Economic Security and Safety Act (VESSA) to expand the reasons for which an employee may take unpaid leave by allowing up to 10 days of unpaid leave to attend a funeral of, make arrangements for, or grieve the death of a family or household member who is killed in a crime of violence. The unpaid leave must be used within 60 days after the date the employee learns of the death of a family or household member and is subject to exceptions where other leave is

applicable. Employees must provide an employer with at least 48 hours' notice of the employee's intention to take the leave unless providing such notice is not practicable. This law is effective January 1, 2024.

HB 2518 / Public Act 103-0315 (Croke, M. / Turner, D.) extends the estimated dates of completion for redevelopment projects, or TIF districts, throughout the state. A proposed amendment to the bill during the legislative process would have placed a new requirement in statute for the Governor, Senate President, and Speaker of the House to receive written support from each school district and community college district within a redevelopment project area prior to the TIF receiving an extension. IAPD expressed concerns over the exclusion of other units of local government from this requirement because current practice requires letters of support from all units of local government. A subsequent amendment removed the language relating to school districts and community college districts prior to passage by the full General Assembly. This law is effective immediately.

Effective January 1, 2024, <u>HB 2782 / Public Act 103-0324 (Williams, A. / Villivalam, R.)</u> will require investment managers to disclose to each governmental unit, public agency, pension fund, or retirement system for whom the investment manager is acting as a fiduciary the process through which they prudently integrate sustainability factors into their investment decision-making, investment analysis, portfolio construction, due diligence, and investment ownership in order to maximize anticipated risk adjusted financial returns, identify projected risk, and execute the manager's fiduciary duties prior to the award of a contract.

HB 3301 / Public Act 103-0324 (Costa Howard, T. / Halpin, M.) will add individuals under an independent contractor arrangement to the types of newly hired employees that employers are required to report to the Illinois Department of Employment Security. The legislation is intended to assist the State in locating individuals that use their status as an independent contractor to avoid paying child support. This law is effective January 1, 2024.

The Governor also approved several measures amending the Prevailing Wage Act, all of which are effective January 1, 2024. HB 3370 / Public Act 103-0346 (Vella, D. / Castro, C.) will require that the prevailing wage be paid on public works projects paid for wholly or in part out of public funds that are power washing projects in which steam or pressurized water is used to remove paint or other coatings, oils or grease, corrosion, or debris from a surface or to prepare a surface for a coating. HB 3792 / Public Act 103-0359 (Walsh, L., Jr. / Stadelman, S.) will require the prevailing wage for construction projects involving fixtures or permanent attachments on light poles owned by a public body unless the project is performed by employees employed directly by the

public body. Another law the Governor previously signed, <u>HB 3491 / Public Act 103-0048 (Hanson, M. / Preston, W.)</u> will provide that any laborer, worker, or mechanic employed by a contractor or subcontractor that is paid less than the prevailing wage with a right of action for the difference between the amount paid and the prevailing rates required to be paid.

SB 74 / Public Act 103-0369 (Peters, R. / Meyers-Martin, D.) is intended to address difficulties some homeowners in Cook County have experienced in paying delinquent property taxes. The law creates the Property Tax Payment Plan Task Force to study and make recommendations for the implementation of payment plan options for delinquent property taxes in Cook County that prevents eligible tax-delinquent owner-occupied properties from being sold at an annual tax sale. The Task Force must take into consideration the impact of the payment plan options on homeowners, taxpayers, local agencies responsible for the collection of property taxes, and local taxing districts and submit a report to the General Assembly no later than November 15, 2023. This law is effective immediately.

SB 895 / Public Act 103-0373 (Halpin, M. / Johnson, G.) amends the Township Code, the Municipal Code, and the Counties Code to restrict these governments from constructing or otherwise altering or maintaining transportation-related infrastructure outside of their corporate boundaries unless that work is performed in an adjacent municipality or township, is jointly performed with another county, municipality, or township pursuant to an intergovernmental agreement, or is provided as necessary relief services following a disaster. SB 895 was compromise legislation that was filed in response to IAPD's opposition to SB 249 (Halpin, M.), which would have required employees of a public body be paid the prevailing wage rate when performing the construction or demolition of public works on behalf of another public body, thereby impeding intergovernmental cooperation. As a direct result of IAPD's advocacy efforts, all references to the Prevailing Wage Act were removed from the new law, which is effective January 1, 2024.

Beginning January 1, 2024, <u>SB 1710 / Public Act 103-0386 (Simmons, M. / Huynh, H.)</u> will require local authorities responsible for paved public bicycle trails to erect permanent signage alerting pedestrians and cyclists of highway crossings and would similarly require authorities with jurisdiction over highways to place signage in advance of bicycle trail crossings. Additionally, if local authorities have actual knowledge of emergencies or safety hazards that create a dangerous condition, they would be required to take reasonable steps to erect temporary signage alerting pedestrians or cyclists to the dangerous condition.

As originally introduced, the legislation would have required permanent signage in advance of all vehicle crossings and contained ambiguous language relating to signage for temporary hazards. Because of IAPD's concerns about the ability of IAPD member agencies to implement these requirements due to ambiguity in, and the breadth of, the proposed language, the measure was amended to require temporary signage only where there is actual knowledge of an emergency or safety hazard that creates a dangerous condition and permanent signage only at highway crossings.

The legislation discussed above are only a small sample of the hundreds of measures that IAPD tracked during the Spring Session. RE: Millions in LWCF Funding Now Available

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources has announced that the next Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) grant cycle is now open.

Similar to OSLAD, LWCF provides up to 50% funding assistance to eligible units of local government to acquire land for public outdoor recreation areas; however, development projects are not eligible.

LWCF awards a maximum of \$750,000 in grant funding per acquisition project.

Applications for LWCF grants must be submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. on September 30, 2023.

Although the Notice of Funding Opportunity does not state the total amount of funding available, we believe there is at least \$18 million in funding available so if you have an acquisition project we strongly encourage you to apply.

For specific details on the program, including scoring criteria and grant program rules and restrictions, we encourage you to review the <u>Notice of Funding Opportunity</u>.

All applications must be submitted through the State's <u>AmpliFund grant management system</u>.

All applicants must be pre-qualified through the <u>State of Illinois Grantee Portal</u>. Additional information on prequalification is available <u>here</u>.

RE: Fifth IAPD Platform Bill Signed into Law

As we previously reported, IAPD secured the passage of **five** Legislative Platform bills during the Spring Session. <u>The Governor previously approved four of these bills</u>, and late last Friday he signed the fifth platform bill into law!

SB 2123 / Public Act 103-0467 (Morrison, J. / Stuart, K.) clarifies that if a park board changes the number or length of terms of commissioners after an election cycle has begun, i.e., once the candidate petition process has commenced, the change will not be effective until after that election cycle. This change will avoid any confusion and possible litigation under the old law which used the date 60 days prior to the election as the determining date.

This IAPD Platform bill passed the General Assembly as part of this year's 143-page omnibus elections bill, but you can find these changes on pages 134-139.

The Governor also approved several other measures that impact IAPD member agencies as discussed below.

HB 2949 / Public Act 103-0438 (Scherer, S. / Murphy, L.) is the culmination of nearly five years of IAPD negotiations on previous bills from the past

three General Assemblies, some of which would have imposed nearly 20 pages of training, administration, and notification requirements on park districts related to asthma medication, epinephrine injectors, and opioid antagonists used by program participants. Those proposals would have also required park districts to adopt certain emergency response protocols related thereto and would have exposed them to potential liability.

As a result of IAPD's advocacy efforts during the past five years, the new law HB 2949 / Public Act 103-0438 (Scherer, S. / Murphy, L.) simply permits, but does not require, park district personnel to administer an epinephrine injector to a child whom they believe in good faith is having an anaphylactic reaction if the employee has completed an anaphylaxis training program conducted by a nationally recognized organization experienced in training laypersons in emergency health treatment such as the online program offered by the American Red Cross as listed on the IDPH website.

Similarly, the law permits, but does not require, personnel to administer asthma medication to any child they believe in good faith to be experiencing respiratory distress. In both cases, the legislation requires program personnel to first inform the child's parents or guardian in writing that the program personnel shall incur no liability for the administration of the injector or asthma medication.

The law also provides liability protection for park districts by requiring a child's parents or guardian to also sign a statement acknowledging that the personnel shall not be held liable for any injury and indemnifying and holding harmless the park district and its employees and agents against any claims arising out of the administration of the injection or medication unless the conduct was willful or wanton. This law is effective immediately.

Beginning January 1, 2024, <u>HB 3516 / Public Act 103-0450 (Syed, N. / Villivalam, R.)</u> will amend the Blood Donation Leave Act to require employers with 51 or more employees to allow employees to use up to 10 days of paid leave in any 12-month period to serve as an organ donor.

SB 1824 / Public Act 103-0464 (Villa, K. / Yang Rohr, J.) will require new IMRF authorized agents to complete a course of training regarding their duties and responsibilities within 3 months after their appointment. IMRF would be responsible for providing the training online at no cost. The bill also provides that earnings increases that are 1) due to amounts paid as required by federal or state law or court mandate, or 2) due to the participating employee returning to the regular number of hours worked after having a temporary reduction in the number or hours worked, are excluded from an employee's salary increase for purposes of determining whether the employer must make an accelerated

payment for annual increases above 6%. This law is also effective January 1, 2024.

SB 2034 / Public Act 103-0466 (Villa, K. / West, M., II.) will create the Child Extended Bereavement Leave Act to provide unpaid leave to certain employees who experience the loss of child by suicide or homicide. An employee of an employer with 250 or more full-time employees would be entitled to use a maximum of 12 weeks of unpaid leave, and an employee of an employer with more than 50 but fewer than 250 full-time employees would be entitled to use a maximum of 6 weeks of unpaid leave. An individual who uses leave under this new Act would be unable to use leave because of the death of a child under the existing Child Bereavement Leave Act. This law is effective January 1, 2024.

In our <u>end of session update</u>, we reported on <u>SB 1515 (Cervantes, J. / Delgado, E.)</u>, which the Governor vetoed last Friday.

By way of background, federal immigration law currently requires employers to verify that their employees are lawfully authorized to work in the U.S. The legislation vetoed by the Governor was intended to address circumstances where an employer has terminated an employee after receiving a "no match" letter from a state or federal agency indicating there is a discrepancy between the agency's records and information provided by the employee to the employer. The Governor's veto message indicates that he vetoed the bill at the request of the bill's sponsors and advocates due to irreconcilable drafting errors that would have an adverse effect on the workers it seeks to protect.

The bills discussed above are only a small sample of the hundreds of measures that IAPD tracked during the Spring Session. The program was initially financed with "Build Illinois" bond money subject to an annual appropriation by the Illinois General Assembly. In 1989, Senate Bill 1463 was enacted (PA 86-925), which earmarked a portion of the State's Real Estate Transfer Tax as a dedicated funding source for the OSLAD program. The program became fully funded in FY'95 and provides millions annually for local park and open space initiatives. The amount of money available varies on a yearly basis due to the fluctuation in the real estate market.
